Nymox Reports Second Quarter Financial Results for 2007

HASBROUCK HEIGHTS, NJ (August 14, 2007) Nymox Pharmaceutical Corporation (NASDAQ: NYMX) announced today its financial results for the quarter ending June 30, 2007. Nymox reported a net loss of \$1,464,950, or \$0.05 per share for the second quarter of 2007, compared to \$1,360,621, or \$0.05 per share for same period in 2006. Product sales amounted to \$215,789 for the six months ending June 30, 2007, compared to \$212,949 for the same period in 2006. The weighted average number of common shares at June 30, 2007 was 28,759,024, compared to 27,327,305 at June 30, 2006.

Nymox Pharmaceutical Corporation is a biotechnology company engaged in the research and development of therapeutics and diagnostics, with a particular emphasis on products targeted for the unmet needs of the aging population. Currently Nymox has three products on the market, and a healthy pipeline of drug and diagnostic products. The Company also has several hundred patents and patent applications. The Company is in late stage development of NX-1207, a drug for benign prostatic hyperplasia (BPH). Nymox has a number of drugs in development for E. coli infection, Alzheimer's disease, oncology, and infectious disease. The Company markets NicAlert™ and TobacAlert™ tests for measuring tobacco product exposure, and AlzheimerAlert™, a test to aid in the diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease.
